This biggest change has been the amalgamation of the 9 watershed stewardship groups under SAW and the new formation of 5 watershed districts to provide watershed programming and education to the entire province of Saskatchewan. Our largest program currently in Saskatchewan is the Prairie Watersheds Climate Program. It is in partnership with the Manitoba Association of Watersheds.
